FOCUS FISTULA INTERVENTION AREAS



Prevention (maternal health, safe birth and fistula prevention) **Treatment** (simple, complex and so-called "incurable" cases of obstetric and iatrogenic fistula; and reconstructive surgery for congenital malformations and trauma)

Training (of Doctors, Surgical Technicians and other healthcare professionals)

Patient reintegration (trauma assessment and recommendation for reintegration)

Community Mobilization (raising awareness in communities for prevention and treatment)

Collaboration (strategic partnerships and national and international collaboration) **Advocacy** (policy influence; and media campaigns)

Data and Research (Database, Studies, Scientific Presentations)



FISTULA PREVENTION AND TREATMENT PROGRAM

Focus Fistula contributes to the National Program for the Prevention and Treatment of Obstetric Fistula, working in collaboration with the Ministry of Health and with the support of national and international partners.

Obstetric Fistula

In Mozambique, there are an estimated 2,300 new cases of obstetric fistula per year, with the health system's limited capacity to provide fistula repair services.



The country treats an average of 500 fistula patients per year, of which the Ministry of Health treats around 300 mostly simple cases, and around 200 mostly complex cases are treated by Focus Fistula

Focus Fistula has contributed free surgeries to patients in most rural areas; in the training of doctors, surgical technicians, SMI nurses and other health professionals; supporting the improvement of operating rooms and wards in provincial hospitals; and raising awareness in communities about prevention and treatment.



RECONSTRUCTIVE SURGERY PROGRAM



Focus Fístula offers life-changing surgeries for women, adolescents and children, from different provinces of the country, suffering from complex or incurable cases, such as:

Sexual development disorders, congenital malformations, Rokitansky Syndrome, posterior urethral valves, prolapses, genital mutilation due to traumatic situations, and other traumas of the urological and urogenital tract.

These surgeries involve a specialized surgical team of surgeons, intensivists, specialized nurses and advanced equipment, and are generally very expensive.

Focus Fistula surgeries are free for the patient.

Focus Fistula supports the referral of these patients towards social reintegration.

CONGENITAL MALFORMATION, ROKITANSKY SYNDROME, GENITAL MUTILATION

CONTEXT

In developed countries, congenital malformations are diagnosed at birth and operated on as early as possible.

In Mozambique, the diagnosis is not made either in the delivery rooms or in postnatal consultations and the majority of children grow up without a diagnosis and only in adolescence do they come across the malformations and end up waiting 15-30 years for a diagnosis and treatment.

We also have many cases in the country of traumatic situations of genital mutilation, mainly the result of acts of violence against children related to harmful traditional practices and human organ trafficking.

There is no precise data on existing cases, causes and prevalence. Cases that are diagnosed are not treated and only those who can afford it can seek help from professionals in private clinics or abroad, as pelvic and genital reconstructive surgery is very expensive.

The development of reconstructive surgery in Mozambique as such is still at an embryonic stage and many patients remain without treatment for life.

People in these conditions face traumatic stigma and discrimination from society in general, especially during puberty, and some are rejected, abused and isolated by their families and communities.











Para reduzir a expansão desta doença. Médica Ginecologista Elenia Carlos explicou as causas que podem levar a esta

"A Gravidez precoce é uma das principais causas mas também temos outras causas, onde a capacidade de ir a uma unidade sanitária está diminuída. demora ter institucional ou seia o parto na

faz com que a mulher tenha o parto em casa ou demora ir a uma unidade sanitária ou seja, a demora de procura de serviços de cuidados de saúde ou por ignorância que não sabia que devia ter o parto na unidade sanitária, não teve uma informação a tempo para poder fazer essa consulta

A médica foi mais longe e advertiu as adolescentes de modo a se prevenirem da Doença. "Prevenir o custo para tratar uma fístula em termos cirúrgicos é muito teluroso ou seja gastase muitos recursos para poderem corrigir a fístula. falamos de cirurgias que podem levar uma hora duas horas, há cirurgias que até levam 5 h. " Frisou.

A Directora da Escola louvou a Iniciativa e apelou que as palestras desta natureza sejam frequentes.

"Foi uma palestra agradável, e necessária para educação. porque não se pode esperar ou pensar que a doença só atinge a pessoas adultas então adolescentes também podem sofrer desta doença, e é preciso de facto preveni-las dando este conhecimento do surgimento da Doença e da sua existência", Disse.

O dia Internacional para acabar com a fístula obstétrica, é comemorado anualmente para aumentar significativamente a consciencialização, intensificar acções, fortalecer parcerias e mobilizar apoio para acabar com a patología. no contexto mais amplo de melhoria da saúde materna. e este ano a campanha é promovida sob o lema, "acabe com a fístula agora, invista em cuidados de saúde de qualidade, capacite as comunidades".
